

Jext[®] Prescriber Checklist

Please ensure that you as a prescriber are able to answer 'yes' to the questions below related to prescription, user instruction and storage and care of Jext[®].

➤ Prescription

Does the patient weigh between **15kg** and **30kg**? Prescribe Jext[®] **150** micrograms

Does the patient weigh above **30kg**? Prescribe Jext[®] **300** micrograms

Has the patient been prescribed two Jext[®] auto-injectors?

Has the patient been recommended to carry two Jext[®] auto-injectors with them at all times?

➤ Instructions for use

Has the patient been shown the correct handling and administration technique?

Has the patient been instructed to contact emergency services to request an ambulance and to state "anaphylaxis" after using their Jext[®] auto-injector even if the symptoms seem to improve?

Is the patient aware to administer a second Jext[®] auto-injector after 5-15 minutes in the absence of clinical improvement?

Has the patient been provided with a Jext[®] Trainer for future administration technique training?

Has the patient been instructed not to carry or store their Jext[®] Trainer with their Jext[®] auto-injector?

Has the patient been provided the Patient Information Card for additional training and guidance?

➤ Storage and care

Has the patient been instructed to store their Jext[®] below 25 °C and to avoid freezing the product?

Has the patient been instructed to periodically check the adrenaline solution through the viewing window of the unit to make sure the solution is clear and colourless and to replace the auto-injector if the solution is discoloured or contains a precipitate?

Has the patient been advised to regularly check their Jext[®] and ensure it is replaced within the expiry date?

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Jext[®] is a pre-filled pen (auto-injector) delivering one dose of adrenaline (as tartrate).



➤ Jext[®] is indicated in the emergency treatment of severe acute allergic reactions (anaphylaxis) to insect stings or bites, foods, drugs and other allergens as well as idiopathic or exercise induced anaphylaxis.



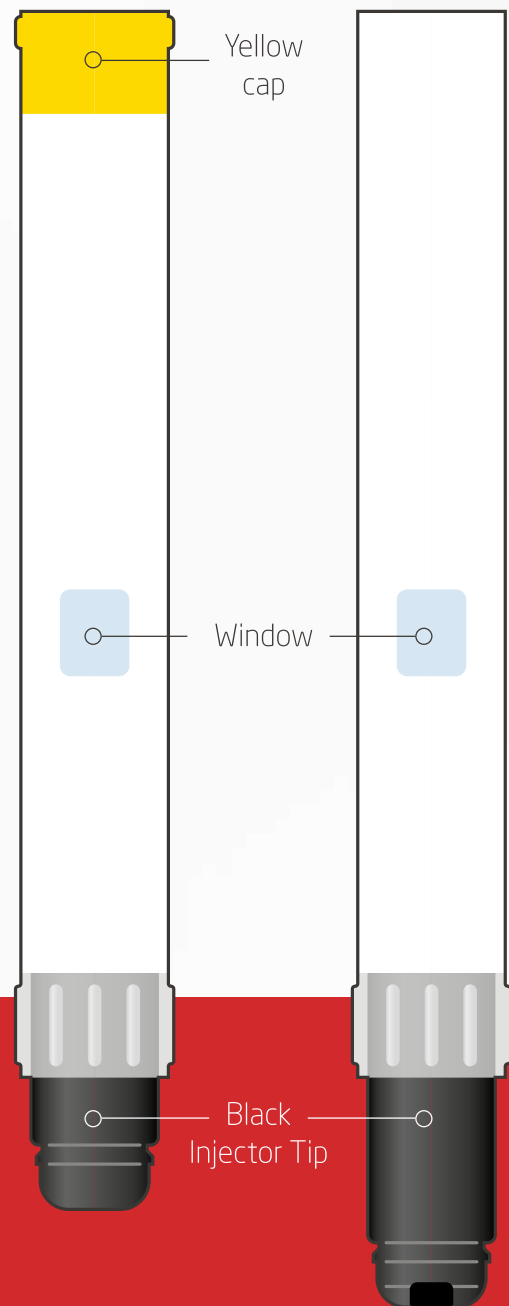
➤ Education of patients and caregivers is crucial to ensure timely and correct handling and administration of adrenaline in emergency situations, and consequently an important part of risk management for the patient. Knowledge of proper administration technique and device care furthermore decreases the risk of accidental or unnecessary drug administration, minimizing the risk of adverse reactions.



➤ The purpose of this check list is to aid you as the prescriber in instructing the patient and/or caregivers in correct use, storage and care of Jext[®]. The checklist may be used as a general instructional tool or for documenting consultations of individual patients.
