

PATIENT ALERT CARD TEXT FOR NON-ONCOLOGY INDICATIONS

<p><u>Ruxience Alert Card for patients with non-oncology diseases</u></p> <p>Why have I been given this card?</p> <p>This medicine may make you more likely to get infections. This card tells you:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• What you need to know before having Ruxience• What the signs of an infection are• What to do if you think you might be getting an infection. <p>It also includes your name and doctor's name and phone number on the back.</p> <p>What should I do with this card?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Keep this card with you all the time - such as in your wallet or purse.• Show this card to any doctor, nurse or dentist you see - not just the specialist who prescribes your Ruxience. <p>Keep this card with you for 2 years after your last dose of Ruxience. This is because side effects can develop several months after you have had treatment.</p> <p>When should I not have Ruxience?</p> <p>Do not have Ruxience if you have an active infection or a serious problem with your immune system.</p> <p>Tell your doctor or nurse if you are taking or have previously taken medicines which may affect your immune system this includes chemo-therapy.</p> <p>What are the signs of getting an infection?</p>	<p>What else do I need to know?</p> <p>Rarely Ruxience can cause a serious brain infection, called "Progressive Multifocal Leukoencephalopathy" or PML. This can be fatal.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Signs of PML include:<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Confusion, memory loss or problems thinking- Loss of balance or a change in the way you walk or talk- Decreased strength or weakness on one side of your body- Blurred vision or loss of vision. <p>If you get any of these, tell a doctor or nurse straight away. 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Look out for the following possible signs of infection:

- Fever or cough all the time
- Weight loss
- Pain without injuring yourself
- Feeling generally unwell or listless.

If you get any of these, tell a doctor or nurse straight away.

You should also tell them about your Ruxience treatment.
