- ▶ This Patient Card helps you to identify symptoms of lung problems that you may experience with ENHERTU®.
- ▶ Read this information before you start receiving ENHERTU® and before each infusion.
- ▶ You should keep this card with you at all times and show it to any doctor you consult (for example, if your treating doctor is unavailable or if you are travelling).

Important Potential Lung Problems that May Occur with Your Treatment

Patients treated with ENHERTU® may be at risk for serious and potentially fatal side effects of lung problems. Early detection and treatment of lung problems are important to reduce this risk.

It is important to call or see your doctor immediately at the pre-agreed health facility if you notice

any of the following signs or symptoms during treatment such as those listed here:

- **Cough,**
- **shortness of breath,**
- **fever,**
- **or other new or worsening breathing problems**

You should seek medical assistance as soon as possible. Under no circumstances should you attempt to treat these symptoms yourself.

Before Starting Treatment with ENHERTU® and before each infusion

Tell your doctor about

- ▶ Any lung or heart problem you have or have had in the past, in particular if you have a history of lung problems, including inflammation of the lung known as interstitial lung disease (ILD).
- ▶ Any other medical problems you have or have had in the past.

- ▶ All the medicines you take, including prescription and over-the-counter medicines, vitamins, and herbal supplements. Know the medicines you take. Keep a list of them to show your doctor.

Reporting side effects

If you get any side effects, talk to your doctor or pharmacist. This includes any possible side effects not listed in this leaflet.
