The IV edition of Med-In Pharma was organised by the MMA in collaboration with the Department of Pharmacy at the UoM and LESM.

Contributions from international professionals and local researchers provided insights into current developments and future directions in the pharmaceutical and regulatory landscape.

Expert presentations and panels addressed regulatory practice, medical device requirements, public health financing, quality and risk management and emerging technologies in pharmaceuticals.

Sessions delivered by international and local medical professionals and academics, focused on developments in oncological surgery, robotics, AI and minimally invasive metabolic procedures.

The conference was complemented by poster presentations and an oral communication session showcasing research related to innovative techniques, advancements in medical devices and medical technology and emerging trends across medicine, surgery, pharmacy, dentistry and applied sciences.

AWARD IN PHARMACEUTICAL DISTRIBUTION AUDITING | OCTOBER

The MMA Academy for Patient-Centred Excellence & Innovation in Regulatory Sciences delivered a course on *Pharmaceutical Distribution Auditing* designed to equip participants with essential knowledge, practical skills and competencies for conducting effective audits within regulated pharmaceutical distribution environments.

The three-day course covered key areas including risk-based audit planning, conflict resolution, data integrity and regulatory preparedness, supporting continuous improvement and the safe distribution of medical products.

The webinar titled *Testing Kits Unboxed* delivered by the MMA Academy explored the expanding landscape of direct-to-consumer testing kits. Participants engaged in a structured overview of analytical integrity, clinical integration and regulatory oversight. The presentations and panel discussion highlighted key public health considerations, the risks associated with non-compliant or poorly validated products and the evolving regulatory framework including preparedness for emerging technologies such as AI-enabled diagnostics.

The event attracted fifty (50) participants, including pharmacists, regulatory and quality specialists, medical doctors, medical students and genetic counsellors.

MED SAFETY WEEK 2025 | NOVEMBER

Since 2018, the MMA has been actively participating in the MedSafetyWeek, a global social media campaign coordinated by the Uppsala Monitoring Centre. This initiative brings together organisations from one hundred eighteen (118) countries worldwide to raise awareness on the importance of reporting side effects. This year's campaign focused on the theme: "*How we can all help make medicines safer.*"



Throughout the week, educational materials enhancing the importance of side effect reporting by healthcare professionals and patients were shared across social media platforms. These reports remain an essential tool for monitoring and improving the safety of medicines.

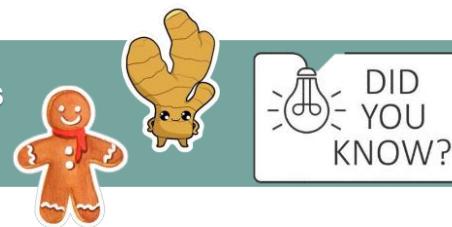
WORLD ANTI-MICROBIAL RESISTANCE AWARENESS WEEK 2025 | NOVEMBER

Pink October and Movember

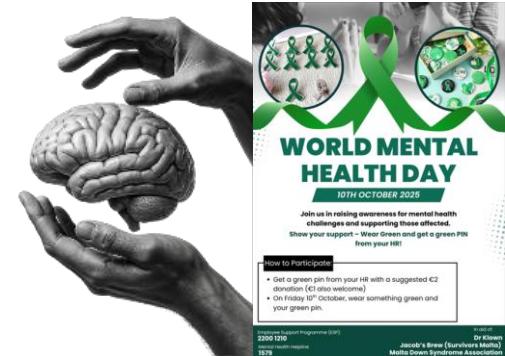

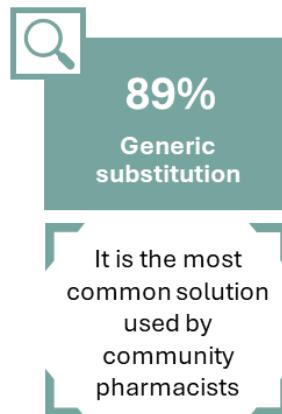
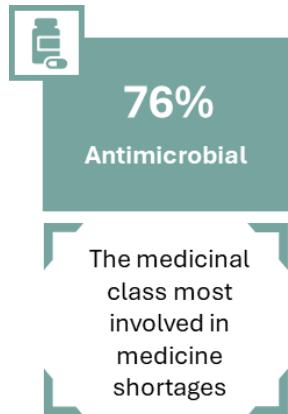

Pharma Package – Building a Fair and Competitive EU Market | DECEMBER

The EC and EP reached a provisional agreement on the pharma package, a major reform of EU pharmaceutical legislation. The reform aims to ensure fair access to safe, effective and affordable medicines, while strengthening the competitiveness of the pharmaceutical sector by reducing regulatory burdens and improving supply security to prevent and manage shortages.

The agreement addresses four (4) key themes:

JAMS 2.0 WORK PACKAGES – WP 5: SIGNAL DETECTION AND VIGILANCE

The Joint Action for Reinforced Market Surveillance of MDs and IVDs (JAMS 2.0) is divided into eight (8) WPs, all contributing to the achievement of the objectives set out in the project through defined tasks.



WP 5 – Signal detection and Vigilance

The WP5 consisted of two (2) workshops (WS2 and WS3) focusing on a comprehensive analysis of the information in the assessment reports based on the Manufacturer Incident Reports and the current application of International Medical Device Regulators Forum codes.



Technical discussions were held on the development of training materials for competent authorities, as well as on signal detection in medical device vigilance including definitions. The sessions covered key concepts such as data sources and signal handling. Participants were also given practical demonstrations focusing on the technical implementation of signal detection with the use of AI and statistical analysis.
